ITEMS COLLECTED FOR RECYCLING

MATERIAL	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE	WHAT NOT TO RECYCLE
 <p>GLASS</p>	All glass containers (clear, brown, green/blue)	Remove lids and metal. Rinse clean. You do not need to remove labels.	No drinking glasses, window glass, Pyrex dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, ceramic or any glass that is not a container.
 <p>ALUMINUM & STEEL (TIN) CANS</p>	Aluminum beverage cans. Aluminum foil, pie pans, TV dinner trays. Steel food and beverage cans.	Empty contents. Rinse and flatten to conserve space.	Do not deposit material that have not been cleaned of food waste.
 <p>PLASTIC</p>	ONLY plastic milk, water and juice jugs, soda bottles, and detergent containers.	Remove the cap, rinse and flatten to conserve space.	No shampoo, or soap bottles. No motor oil containers, margarine "tubs" or plastic bags. No foam or plastic cups or plates.
 <p>NEWSPAPERS</p>	Clean, dry, untied and unbagged newspapers and all inserts that come with the newspaper.	Fold newspapers and stack neatly in the walk-in newspaper recycling trailer.	No telephone books, or paper other than newspapers.
<p>MAGAZINES & CATALOGS</p>	Clean, dry magazines and catalogs.	Deposit magazines and catalogs in recycling container.	No hard cover books.
 <p>CORRUGATED CARDBOARD</p>	Corrugated cardboard boxes that are clean and dry. Brown paper bags.	Break the boxes down and lay flat to conserve space.	No food product boxes, detergent boxes, wax coated boxes or plastic lined boxes.
 <p>YARD TRIMMINGS</p>	Grass clippings, brush, leaves and limbs. Practice home composting when possible.	Cut limbs from trunks and branches from limbs to conserve container space.	No stumps, rocks, soil or gravel. No land clearing debris.
 <p>SCRAP METALS APPLIANCES</p>	Dishwashers, stoves, water heaters, washing machines, refrigerators and other scrap metals.	To the extent possible, remove all rubber, plastic, glass including drawers, shelves, dividers, racks.	No Large Vehicle Tires Example: Large trucks, tractors, trailers, etc. No Commercial Tires
 <p>TIRES</p>	From passenger type vehicles only. Limit 5 per household.	Remove all metal rims from tires. NO RIMS	
 <p>ANTIFREEZE</p>	From passenger type vehicles.	Place in container with lid. No solvents or water. Antifreeze only.	
 <p>USED MOTOR OIL & FILTERS</p>	Oil from cars and other vehicles. Transmission fluid & hydraulic fluid. Used oil filters.	Place oil in container with lid. Keep oil free of water and solvents.	No gasoline, solvents of any kind or antifreeze.

WASTE COLLECTED FOR DISPOSAL

<p>BULK WASTE</p>		<p>Chairs, sofas, tables, mattresses, television sets and large furniture items, etc. *Large items can be taken directly to the Landfill. *No Concrete</p>
<p>HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE</p>	<p>Separate Recyclable materials. Revenue benefits recycle program and saves Landfill space.</p>	<p>Kitchen waste, food packaging, junk mail and unusable old clothing, ect.</p>

No fee is charged to Monroe County residents when they bring their household garbage, bulk waste and recyclables to any Monroe County Recycling and Waste Collection Center.

Monroe County Recycling and Waste Collection Centers are for the use of Monroe County Residents only. The attendant may ask for proof of residency. Monroe County Recycling and Waste Collection Centers DO NOT accept material generated from any type of Commercial Facility / Operation.

Recycling is not mandatory. Residents are asked to voluntarily separate materials that can be recycled from their household garbage and place them in the appropriate recycling containers. Help Monroe County promote Recycle programs and save landfill space.

The Monroe County Recycling and Waste Collection Centers are **NOT** equipped to handle large volumes of waste materials from one source. Only 1 load per day for Bulk and Inert Material. Large truck loads and multi-loads of material will be taken directly to the landfill. **The Landfill will not accept Stumps / Land clearing debris.** Any questions concerning accepted material, contact the Landfill Manager.

When transporting any garbage, trash, refuse or any cargo, use containers, tarpaulins or other devices that would effectively prevent materials from spilling or blowing from the vehicle onto county roads and right-of-ways. It is the law.

It is unlawful to dump garbage, recyclables or refuse of any type at the gate of any Center when the Centers are closed. It is unlawful to dump garbage and refuse at the sites where dumpsters have been removed or any place that is not specifically designated as a waste collection/disposal facility.
